- Schedule a family meeting to discuss the dangers of possible emergency.
- Discuss how you and your family will respond to each possible emergency.
- Draw a floor plan of your home and mark two escape routes from each room.
- Choose an out-of-state friend or relative for all family members to call or text if separated during an emergency.
- Pick two meeting places one near your home and one outside your neighborhood in case you cannot return home after an emergency.
- Keep family records in a water- and fireproof safe.

Public Health Emergency Preparedness

PHEP is a full range of prevention, mitigation, and recovery activities aimed towards preventing disease and reducing death rates in the event of an emergency or disaster. PHEP strategies expand upon dayto-day public health best practices and build upon existing systems and partnerships. Successful PHEP strategies rely heavily on local partnerships with community stakeholders and are not developed alone. The goal is to build a more resilient community that is prepared to deal with and rapidly recover from threats and emergencies that affect the health of the public.

Oklahoma Medical Reserve Corps

The Medical Reserve Corps is designed to bring together practicing and retired healthcare professionals from a diversity of fields, including physicians, nurses, hospital and public health workers, mental health experts, and other medical professions. In addition, volunteers without a background in medical training are needed.

These professionals, working together with the non-medical volunteers, comprise the corps, which supplements existing "first responder" emergency systems.

The Response Readiness Framework defines excellence in response, focusing on improvements in emergency response operations designed to improve response outcomes and provides a coordinated strategy for CDC, our preparedness partners, and our PHEP jurisdictions, to ensure we are all working together to reach common response goals. This framework guides CDC guidance and funding for health departments nationwide through the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) cooperative agreement program.

2024-2028 PHEP Program Priorities

- 1. Prioritize risk-based approach
- 2. Enhance partnerships
- 3. Expand local support

- 4. Improve administrative and budget preparedness systems
- 5. Build workforce capacity
- 6. Modernize data collection and systems
- 7. Strengthen risk communications activities
- 8. Incorporate health equity practices
- 9. Advance capacity and capability of public health laboratories
- 10. Prioritize community recovery efforts
